The Keel-billed Toucan (*Ramphastos sulfuratus*) is often seen feeding on forest fruits around Moraro. Other species of toucan can also be seen in the area because of the amount of forest fruit trees.

Toucans are intelligent and sometimes interact with humans. They are often found in pairs or small flocks and can be noisy at times.

Their colourful and large bill contributes to their bill-heavy look. They fly short distances from tree to tree. Their colourful beak is attractive and is easily spotted.

You can use felt tip markers to colour your picture of the Toucan. Here, the stroke technique was used. Good luck!
